# **Risk Based Testing - Part II**

There could be many factor which can be considered while calculating risk. Here I have taken two main factors as mentioned below: Risk = Impact \* Probability of Failure

#### What Impact Means

Categorization of Impact suggests the Impact on business process if any functionality failed. In testing, if any category (C, H, M & Low) of script failed to execute. For example if test scripts categorized as High failed to execute it will cause a high impact on business process while a low category of test scripts will cause a low impact. Hence it is very important that we get the appropriate categorization from Business Team defining business requirement.

#### Why we need Impact defined

Adding "Impact" column in Test Scenario and test case inheriting from Business Requirement Document has following benefit including help in RBT analysis:

- This will get us method of identifying the High Risk area within application
- We will have a controlled risk taking approach
- It will provide data points to identify regression Test scripts
- It will be great tool for identifying the candidate for automation
- It will get us the tool for Risk Based Testing Approach
- This will be the only tool to reduce the scope of retesting and re executing test scripts
- This will help defining the "Severity" of the defects while in execution phase

Risk quantification that assists in focusing on overall scale of impact of each risk, also referred as the 'level of damage' potentially caused by the change. This is an estimate of the overall scale of impact if a defect related to the change were found in production.

- Critical impact 5- The problem would cause to stop all major/critical functioning of application. Results in large loss of revenue. Related defect would impact the inability of any Business Unit or any End User to receive services (i.e. customers are unable to complete transactions).
- High impact- 4 Application or transaction that causes significant disruption to production (i.e. customers are not directly affected but back end system not performing).
- Medium impact 3 progress disrupted with large extensions to project schedule and cost, across short and medium terms (i.e. customers are not directly affected but change was made affected other code. Time and research needed to resolve problem).
- Moderate impact 2 progress disrupted with manageable extensions to short-term schedule and cost (i.e. customers are not affected. For example, field added for the business does not work as designed).
- Marginal impact 1 exposure slight (i.e. cosmetic error).

#### What is Probability of Failure?

• This section is primarily own by IT. It suggests failure of coded functionality due to various reasons like Code complexity, Business Complexity, System Architectural design, Impact of peripheral system etc.
